CURRICULUM

Grading: Numeric 0-100 scale. Passing grade is 65.

GPA/Class Rank: All numerically graded courses except Physical Education are included. The grades are not weighted; the highest repeat grade is used to compute grade point average. Class rank is not compiled.

Regents Courses are considered by the New York State Education Department to follow a college preparatory level of study.

Advanced Placement Courses are available in subjects: Biology, Calculus AB, Chemistry, Micro & Macro Economics, English Language, English Literature, Music Theory, Physics I, Physics 2, Psychology, Statistics, US History and World History.

College in the High School

Courses are: AP English Language, College Composition, Literature & Writing, AP US History, Pre-Calculus, AP Statistics, AP Calculus AB, Spanish A, and Business Law, offered through Schenectady Community College.

English

- In Grade 9 a heterogeneous English curriculum is offered.
- An Honors program was available to students in Grade 10.
- AP English Language was an option for Grade 11.
- Seniors may elect to take AP English Literature.

Social Science

All freshmen take an introductory Global History class. Sophomores choose between AP World History and Regents Global Studies. Juniors may pursue a course in AP U.S. History. Seniors may choose AP Economics. AP Psychology is offered as an elective.

Mathematics

Acceleration is available to students in middle school. All students must pass three high school math courses to graduate. Students may progress through Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus and AP Calculus AB. AP Statistics can be taken as an elective.

Science

Acceleration is available to middle school students. Regents coursework is offered in Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry & Physics. Advanced Placement courses are offered in Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Environmental Science, Forensics and Anatomy & Physiology may be taken as electives.

World Language

Instruction begins in middle school. Most students earn one high school credit in grade 8. Spanish is offered for each grade level. AP Spanish is offered in grade 12. College credit is received from Schenectady County Community College for completion of Spanish A and AP Spanish.
